



TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR THE IHSGB YOUTH COMMITTEE

1. The Youth Committee shall consist of the Youth Leader and 3 members of the Society, who should not be Trustees
2. A Quorum shall consist of Youth Leader +1 or all 3 ordinary members.
3. The Youth Leader shall provide a quarterly progress report on current issues to the Trustees.
4. The Youth Committee shall consider, consult with the membership and make recommendations to the Trustees on the following matters:
 - a. All other Youth matters raised by FEIF or for onward consideration by FEIF
 - b. Representation at and IHSGB position on agenda items for, FEIF Youth meetings.
 - c. Rules for Eligibility and Selection of Young Riders in World Championship teams, in association with Sport Team.
 - d. Rules for selection of Youth Cup Teams.
 - e. Rules for selection of Youth Camp participants.
 - f. Rules for the conduct and discipline of Youth, Team Leaders/Country Leader and others whilst attending IHSGB events or representing IHSGB and/or United Kingdom.
 - g. All Youth matters raised by members of IHSGB.
 - h. Any other matter directed by the Trustees or considered necessary by the Youth Leader.
5. Having considered each matter, the Youth Committee shall consult the membership via the IHSGB Newsletter. It is however accepted that matters may arise that require swift resolution and in such cases the Youth Committee shall consult as is practicable.
6. Having consulted the membership, the Youth Committee shall consider the views expressed and make recommendations to the Trustees. If an IHSGB Rule needs to be amended or created, this recommendation must go before meeting of the Trustees. If no such amendment or creation is required, agreement of the Trustees may be by e-mail or other such traceable means.
7. All members of the Youth Committee shall be in possession of and fully conversant with the BHS Child Protection Guidelines, the IHSGB Safeguarding Children Policy and when possible, attend a Child Protection Course (2 hour course, run by the BHS).
