Breeding assessment, young horse assessment

- Email to breeders was sent out in November, sadly no reply received
- Zootechnical Certificate has now been finalised / update on Studbook changes
- JA/EB had contacted the known breeders in order to find out if they would be interested in a full FIZO or young horse assessment in conjunction with the BC's, but nobody was interested except one person (visiting judge to assess young horses). One person had commented that a young horse assessment only costs money and the result doesn't get listed in World Fengur.
- Should we introduce a Young Horse assessment ranking list on our website where the results of assessments could be listed? It would be voluntary, so a breeder who's horse didn't receive a good mark, could decide not to have his horse included in the ranking. TBD in the future.
- At the last trustees meeting the Sports team floated the idea of offering some futurity classes at the BC's which would be open to young horses and could be part of our Breeding Team activities. It would give people with young horses the chance to ride their horses in a competition environment without having the need to show a perfect performance. In a Futurity test (say Fourgait) you show all the gaits and the best parts of the performance are judged by 1 judge. The judge gives a running comment as the rider shows the gaits, so it is also very educational for the spectators. All agreed it was a good idea and it was decided to organise the Futurity test/s.
